Gift of Life Donor Program leads the nation in the most organ donors for the 13th consecutive year thanks to our selfless donors and compassionate donor families. Gift of Life has coordinated the most organ donors in the nation every year since 2008 - the leader among all 57 organ procurement organizations in the U.S.

Gift of Life coordinated life-saving gifts from 619 organ donors in 2020, resulting in 1,619 organs transplanted. Gift of Life's annual donation rate, 55 organ donors-per-million-population, is among the highest in the world.

"Gift of Life Donor Program steadfastly advanced its life-saving mission, even in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic," said Gift of Life President and CEO Howard M. Nathan. "This is a testament to the dedication and expertise of our staff, the commitment of our hospital partners and the inspiring generosity of our donors and donor families. Our compassionate community is the most generous in the nation, choosing to save lives and support families despite their grief and the many challenges of this past year."

Gift of Life also recovered life-enhancing tissues from 2,295 donors, including 1,385 musculoskeletal donors and 1,726 cornea donors.

The Gift of Life team rapidly adapted to new challenges by implementing COVID-19 testing for donors, adjusting procedures and communications with hospitals and families, and securing personal protective equipment (PPE) for its frontline clinical team to ensure our life-saving mission continued.

Gift of Life partners with 128 acute care hospitals and 15 transplant centers across its service area to save and heal lives through organ and tissue donation.

Heroic Donor, Historic Transplant A LIFE TRANSFORMED

Joe DiMeo had just a 6 percent chance of finding a compatible donor for an extraordinary transplant – a new face and hands. *Gift of Life* **Donor Program** found an exact match thanks to the generosity of a donor family and their heroic son.

Joe, 22 suffered third-degree burns over 80 percent of his body in a car crash. He developed a highly sensitized immune system because of multiple blood transfusions and skin grafts after 20 reconstructive surgeries. Bone structure and skin tone were other special factors in finding a donor.

Rare and remarkable gifts from a stranger have transformed Joe's life. Gift of Life Donor Program is proud to have collaborated with an elite team of medical professionals at NYU Langone Health on the first successful face and bilateral hand transplant in history.

The donor's mother shares that she is proud and comforted that her son was able to help another young man while saving and healing others through organ and tissue donation. Her son will always be her "angel," she said.

Son, Singer, Student & Hero

Zion Desmarais made beautiful music singing bass in his high school chorale and all-state chorus. He was an honor student, manager of his school's baseball team and part of an award-winning team of emerging leaders and entrepreneurs. A friend described him as "kind, loving, selfless, humble and strong."



Zion became a hero when he saved and healed lives through organ, tissue and cornea donation at age 18 after a long battle with sickle cell anemia.

"It's what he wanted to do," said Zion's father, Michael Desmarais. Michael's sister saved four lives as a donor when she died as the result of a tornado. Her legacy inspired Zion to register as a donor when he got his driver's license.

Zion's parents are proud of the powerful impact he made in life and proud of his life-saving legacy as a donor. Hundreds of classmates and community members attended a service for him at his high school stadium in Delaware.

Zion's mother, Linda, was reassured by the "tender, beautiful" care he received when he was hospitalized for five days before he passed.

"When he passed on, we were pulverized. Not just broken. Pulverized," Michael said, "It was Gift of Life that really helped us through that. They understood our grief."
