

Gift of Life Donor Care Center

Maximizing Each Donor's Life-Saving Impact

Gift of Life Donor Program has opened the first intensive care unit in the Northeast U.S. exclusively for organ donors. The Gift of Life Donor Care Center at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia will focus on the timely evaluation, allocation and recovery of precious organs that will lead to countless lives saved through transplantation.

The Donor Care Center features six private rooms and three operating rooms and will be open 24/7 365 days a year for donors transferred from hospitals across Gift of Life's region, which spans the eastern half of Pennsylvania, southern New Jersey and Delaware.

The center will ease the burden on critical space and resources in local hospitals with a dedicated team and state-of-the-art facility to care for organ donors. Major advantages include round-the-clock clinical expertise with timely interventions to increase the number of organs for transplant and an efficient, expedient donation process that supports a family's ability to proceed with arrangements to honor their loved one.





"The Gift of Life region has been the most generous in the nation for organ donation every year since 2008. The Gift of Life Donor Care Center honors that generosity by providing a space designed specifically to care for donor heroes and fulfill the powerful decision to save lives through organ donation," said Rick Hasz, Gift of Life president and CEO.

Gift of Life transplant coordinators, our nation's leading donation professionals, will work with a dedicated, highly skilled staff of nurses, nursing assistants and respiratory therapists led by a nurse manager all focused exclusively on donor care. They are supported by a multi-disciplinary ensemble of critical care specialists including physicians, advanced practice providers and pharmacists.



"The Donor Care Center is the result of more than two years of planning and collaboration as Gift of Life, Penn Medicine and hospitals throughout our region continue to lead the way in innovation, best practices and clinical excellence on behalf of donor families and patients waiting for the gift of life," said Christine Radolovic, Gift of Life's chief clinical officer.

More than 5,000 children and adults need a life-saving transplant in Gift of Life's region.



"Organ and tissue donation not only benefits transplant patients. It can bring peace to a donor's family. My son, Sipho Themba, was an organ donor who saved six people," said Cynthia London of Philadelphia, a Gift of Life volunteer ambassador and former board member. "At the Gift of Life Donor Care Center, donation gives comfort to grieving families as donors give life to others."

We honored our heroic organ, tissue and cornea donors from last year at four Life & Legacy Celebrations this fall, including both in-person and virtual options for donor families to attend. Families have described these heartfelt annual ceremonies as "a beautiful way to share memories and hope" and "a wonderful tribute."

Each ceremony featured inspiring speakers, a photo tribute and special music. Donor families received the Gift of Life Donor Medal, matching lapel pins and a handmade wrap as a symbol of comfort. "It was very heartwarming," said one participant. "It made me feel like I was part of something special."

Jan Weinstock Honored as "Knight of the Blind"

Congratulations to Gift of Life's Jan L. Weinstock, Esq. for being honored by the Lions Eve Bank of Delaware Valley with the "Knight of the Blind" Award at their 65th anniversary gala on November 5 in Philadelphia.

Jan is chief administrative officer and general counsel for Gift of Life Donor Program and its

affiliates, Gift of Life Howie's House and Transplant Foundation. Her work with Gift of Life spans more than 30 years.

Jan's far-reaching impact features a key role in drafting and lobbying for Pennsylvania's Act 102, groundbreaking legislation that gave

individuals the opportunity to register as an organ and tissue donor when they obtain or renew their driver's license. Act 102 changed the face of donation and transplantation in the Commonwealth and became a national model when it was signed into law in 1994. The law requires every patient death in a hospital to be referred for evaluation by professionals for organ, tissue and cornea donation. As a result, the waiting list for a cornea transplant was eliminated.

"Time and again, we see families help others through donation once they understand they have that ability and are given the opportunity. We'll continue working to provide a pathway for this incredible generosity until every patient waiting for any transplant is able to receive their gift and live a rich, full life," Jan said.

My SECOND Chance On the worst day of someone's life, they made a decision that saved mine

Most kids heal quickly, but not me. I broke my leg when I was two years old, and I didn't heal for months. I needed a tiny little walker iust to toddle around.

That was just one blow in a short life filled with medical problems. I was born with a failing liver that affected every part of my body including bone formation. I can only imagine how difficult it was for my mom and dad, sitting by the phone as I waited for a liver transplant. They worried I would die before I turned four.

I did get a transplant. I only know two things about my extraordinary gift: my donor was my age, and my donor's parents, on the worst day of their lives, made a selfless decision that saved mine.

I thought of them, and my little walker, as I practiced for the Donate Life Transplant Games of America, where organ transplant recipients and living donors competed in Olympics-style events in

San Diego last summer. As part of Gift of Life's Team Philadelphia, I proudly helped represent our region and competed in basketball, track & field and bowling. My mom started taking me to the Games in 1996 as chance for me to make friends with other young recipients. Seeing everyone together on opening night, cheering, laughing, and crying, knowing we are here because of the generosity of another human being is truly magical.

My mom understood it was also important to spend time with another group: donor family members. Many of them travel with the team to cheer us on. It's a special way for them to see the impact of their loved one's generosity.

I am now a member of a donor family. I lost my mom in 2021 and we knew she would be proud to help others even after she was gone. Her tissue and corneas were used to heal and transform the lives of strangers.



Every day, I am reminded of how lucky I am to be here. I look at my little scar in the mirror, faded after 30 years. My new

liver has never given me any problems. I have only been on one medication for it my entire life. When I saw my transplant doctor recently, he could not believe how healthy I looked.

My donor not only saved my life, they gave me a great life. And I am so grateful.
